In letter from the Min. of Interior to S. N. Castle acknowledging the receipt of his 2 favors of July 28th & August 6th relative to the land of Hamakuapoko - Gives information relative to said land in which he states that on Dec. 10, 1859, the Board of Education had sold a portion of said land to Capt. Thos. Hobron, although said Hamakuapoko was only deeded to the above on Jan. 30, 1860. States that if the Oahu College had suffered any wrong doing, for him to settle the matter with the Bd. of Education - Further states that if the boundaries of Hobron's land are correct, then the sale of the land by the Haiku Plantation of that portion of the land included in Hobron's boundaries would seem to be null & void.
